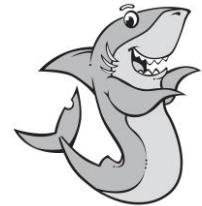

Standards Based Grading:

KUSD is using a standards based progress report K-5 that reports out based on standards (1-4) through Infinite Campus. All grade level progress reports will generally look the same. You will not be seeing letter grades on any of the progress reports. We will be reporting out with 1, 2, 3 and 4. A '3' means that the student is meeting the standard listed independently which is the goal for every child. A '4' demonstrates that the student is distinguished and demonstrates in-depth applications that go beyond the standard listed.
