Summer School 2018

As you know summer school is right around the corner. Notification has been sent home to the students that are recommended for summer school. Please get your student signed up in the office if you are planning on having them attend or you can register via Infinite Campus. If you are interested in using the summer school bus that has limited stops, please contact Linda Emon in the office to sign up. This will help us to plan to meet every child's needs.

Summer school is going to be from 8-12 this year for current preK-4th graders. We will all be getting ready for the grade we will be going into for the 2018-19 school year. All current 5th graders will be attending summer school at their attendance area middle school. Summer school will run from June 20th – July 24th. Stocker does host a recreation program from 10-3 if you are interested in having your child go there after summer school. You will need to sign your child up with the recreation staff during the summer when the program starts. If you have questions or concerns, please call us at 359-2143.

A Note from the School Nurse: "When Should My Child Stay Home?"

Your child should stay home if they have a temperature over 100F, are vomiting (until food can be kept down), have more than one loose stool in a day, have redness in the white part of the eye (with or without drainage), or have a rash (may be first sign of illness). Children should remain at home until their temperature is under 100F **without** fever reducing medication. Doctors need to diagnose pink eye and rashes. In these cases, consult your doctor to determine when it is safe for your child

to return to school and send the medical note to school. If a child has vomited, please have them stay home for 24 hours before returning to school.

Arrival will return to outside on the small and large playground at the beginning of April:

Since we have warmed up and it is lighter outside when students arrive to school, K-5th graders will line up outside at their classroom symbol in the morning before school when we return from spring break. Please ask your child's teacher, if you don't remember where that is.

Remember: Students are not to be dropped off in parent circle before 7:10 as supervision does not start until then. Student safety is our top priority, so please be sure to wait until staff supervision is present. Students attending breakfast can enter at Door #2 starting at 6:55.
